Monitors/Digital Display

When it comes to technology, fit out your huddle space with large wall mounted screens. Whether you're brainstorming concepts for the latest marketing video or analyzing data in a sales report, the availability of a display to screen share is critical. Go as big as your budget and your space allows. A 32"-50" range display is sufficient for most spaces.

When deciding on a mounting height, stay as close to eye level as possible. If the space is utilized for other purposes, plan for a creative solution to conceal the monitors when they are not in use.

Whiteboards

Good old fashioned brainstorming often requires writing it out. Whether it's traditional white enamel, interactive or clear glass... ideas can ebb and flow quickly with whiteboards.

These are great for targeting an agenda so you stay on task, listing ideas you're not ready to act on yet, visualizing your priorities and providing an easy method to modify ideas when you're nar-





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rowing things down in a brainstorm session. At the end of your meeting, simply snap a few pictures of your work so you don't have to write it down again.

Ambience

In an open plan concept, it's more important than ever to have designated collaboration spaces free from noise and distractions. Demountable glass walls have been a great solution for keeping things open and keeping light moving throughout the space.



If you have a dedicated presentation room, acoustical panels can absorb and prevent noise leakage in and out of the room. But don't stop there! Today's acoustic panels can make a huge design statement with color, pattern and texture.

A professional-grade microphone setup can significantly increase the quality of a meeting with native ambient noise reduction and full room coverage.

Natural lighting has been connected to better health and increased employee engagement. Even in open office environments window walls are avoided because they interfere with monitor display causing glare. Huddle spaces provide a great opportunity to take over a window wall. Providing a wide open view to inspire some outside the box thinking.
